

allegations, the Petitioner was in default for failure to appear and failure to participate in the proceedings. Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. r. 616-1-2-.30(1) and (5).

In the absence of any evidence from the Respondent, the recommendations of the Commission are adopted, and it is hereby **ORDERED** as follows:

- (1) Within ninety (90) days of the entry of this Order, the Respondent shall file the Personal Financial Disclosure Statements ("PFDSs") that were due on July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007. The Respondent has filed all required Campaign Contribution Disclosure Reports.²
- (2) Within ninety (90) days of the entry of this Order, the Respondent shall pay a civil penalty totaling \$9,500.00 to the Commission. This amount represents a civil penalty of \$750.00 for each of the four CCDRs that were filed late but before this matter was scheduled for hearing; a civil penalty of \$1,000.00 for each of the three CCDRs that were filed late and after this matter was scheduled for hearing; a civil penalty of \$1,000.00 for each of the two PFDSs that have yet to be filed; and a civil penalty of \$750.00 for the Petitioner's failure to disclose her ownership of real property on her PFDSs for the calendar years 2003 and 2004.
- (2) The Petitioner has paid all outstanding late fees to the Commission.³
- (4) The Respondent shall cease and desist from any further violations of the Ethics in Government Act.

² At the hearing, counsel for the Commission represented that after this matter was scheduled for hearing, the Petitioner filed the CCDRs due on June 30, 2007; December 31, 2007; and June 30, 2008.

³ At the hearing, counsel for the Commission represented that the Petitioner paid \$525.00 to the Commission after this matter was scheduled for hearing. However, as set forth in the Order granting the Commission's Motion for Partial Summary Determination, the Commission was authorized to impose fees of only \$475.00. Accordingly, the Commission shall reimburse the Petitioner for the amount of her overpayment, or, in the alternative, apply the amount of the overpayment to the civil penalty that is imposed herein.
